Senate Floor and Committee votes

E2SHB 1073 – Paid leave coverage. Costly expansion of paid leave program just as it was becoming fully implemented. Signed into law. AGC opposed.

E3SHB 1091 – Transportation fuel/carbon. Low carbon fuel standard that will raise the price of gas without creating funds for infrastructure investments. Signed into law. AGC opposed.

SB 5032 – Alternative public works contracting. Reauthorizes design-build, JOC and GC/CM while making improvements to alternative procurement. Signed into law. AGC supported.

SB 5046 – Workers' comp claim agreements. Provides that workers' comp claims can be settled and paid out in a single lump sum or be paid on a structured basis. Signed into law. AGC supported.

ESSB 5061 – Unemployment insurance. Reduces UI rates that were surging due to pandemic. Signed into law. AGC supported.

ESSB 5092 – Operating budget. Budget assumed passage of capital gains tax. Signed into law. AGC opposed.

ESSB 5096 – Capital gains tax. Establishes new state capital gains tax. Signed into law. AGC opposed.

E2SSB 5126 – Climate commitment act. Establishes new cap-and-trade system for the state but with insufficient investments in infrastructure. Signed into law. AGC opposed.

E2SSB 5141 – Environmental justice task force recommendations. Addresses environmental justice without harmonizing with existing regulatory processes, delaying and perhaps stopping projects. Signed into law. AGC opposed.

ESSB 5478 – Unemployment insurance. Reduces 2022 UI rates that were surging due to the pandemic. Signed into law. AGC supported.

2SHB 1076 – Workplace violations/qui tam. Would have allowed for private lawsuits by trial lawyers or unions on behalf of a state agency to enforce various employment laws. Passed House but died in Senate. AGC opposed.

SB 5064 – Unemployment/voluntary quits. Would have significantly and unnecessarily expanded reasons individuals could quit and still receive UI benefits, increasing UI costs. Passed committee but did not reach Senate floor. AGC opposed.

SSB 5102 – Workers' comp medical exams. Limits the number of independent medical examinations (IMEs) in certain circumstances, ignoring recommendations of broad-based work group. Passed committee but did not reach Senate floor. AGC opposed.

SSB 5333 – Public works contracts/COVID. Would have prohibited clauses in construction contracts from waiving the rights of a contractor to damages or an equitable adjustment arising out of a delay in performance caused by the COVID. Passed committee but did not reach Senate floor. AGC supported.

SB 5481 – Transportation funding bonds. Would have approved bonds associated with a \$17 billion/16-year transportation funding package. Passed committee but did not reach Senate floor. AGC supported.

SSB 5482 – Additive transportation funding. Would have added appropriations to 2021-23 transportation funding with revenue associated with a \$17 billion/16-year transportation funding package. Passed committee but did not reach Senate floor. AGC supported.

SSB 5483 – Transportation revenue. Would have generated revenues associated with a \$17 billion/16-year transportation funding package. Passed committee but did not reach Senate floor. AGC supported.
